Cash Envelope Templates: six celestial-themed printables for building better money habits

I'm so glad you grabbed this pack. There are six designs inside, each with a built-in ledger card so you can log what goes in and out as you cash-stuff your way through the month.

Print on regular letter-size paper. Cardstock (65-110 lb) holds up best if you're planning to reuse an envelope for more than one cycle.

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Getting your envelopes ready

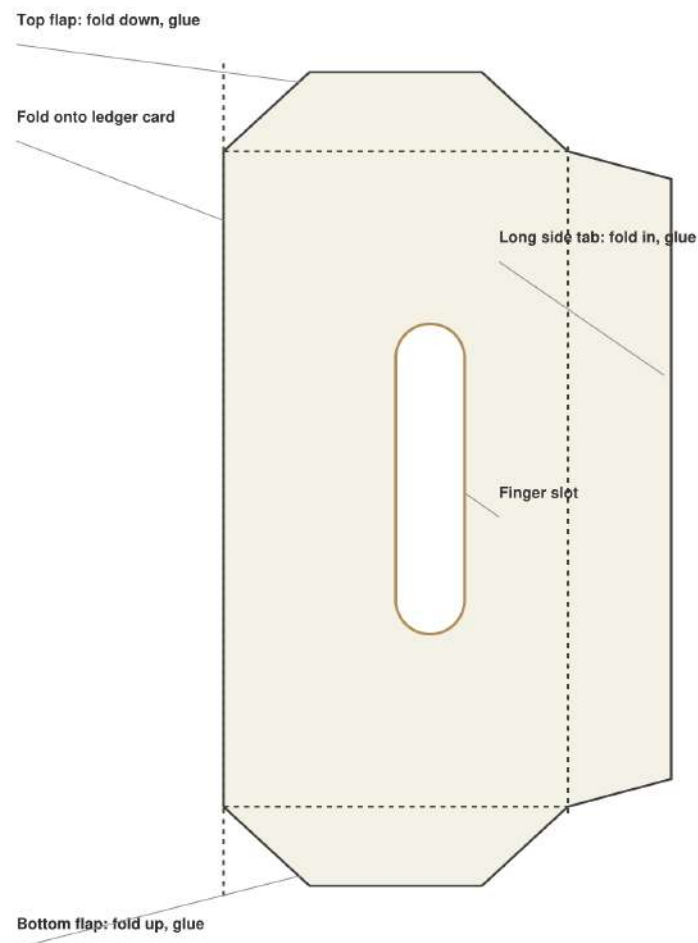
Five steps from printed page to a working cash envelope:

1. Print the envelope page on letter-size paper (see the note on paper weight above).
2. Cut around the outside edge of the shape. A ruler and craft knife give the cleanest line along the straight edges; scissors work fine too.
3. Cut out the finger-slot window if your design has one, so you can see and grab the cash inside or you can leave it as is and use it as an envelope label!
4. Fold along the flap lines. The next page walks through exactly where those are and which pieces glue where.
5. Glue or tape the flaps closed, then start logging on the ledger card as you add and spend.

Quick tip: if you'd like to reuse an envelope for more than one cycle, laminate it (or slide it into a cheap laminating pouch) before cutting the finger slot. It'll hold up to a lot more folding.

How to fold your envelope

Every design in this pack folds the same way. The diagram below shows a plain, unbranded example so the fold lines are easy to see, since your printed envelope pages won't have these lines on them.



Which tabs to glue

Vertical envelopes (the tall design in this pack): glue the top flap, the bottom flap, and the long side tab.

Horizontal envelopes, if you design your own later: glue just the two short flaps and leave one long edge open to slide cash in and out.

The ledger card is a separate panel that sits behind the front flap. Fold the front panel over onto it along the shared edge before gluing the outer tabs, so the two stay together as one piece.

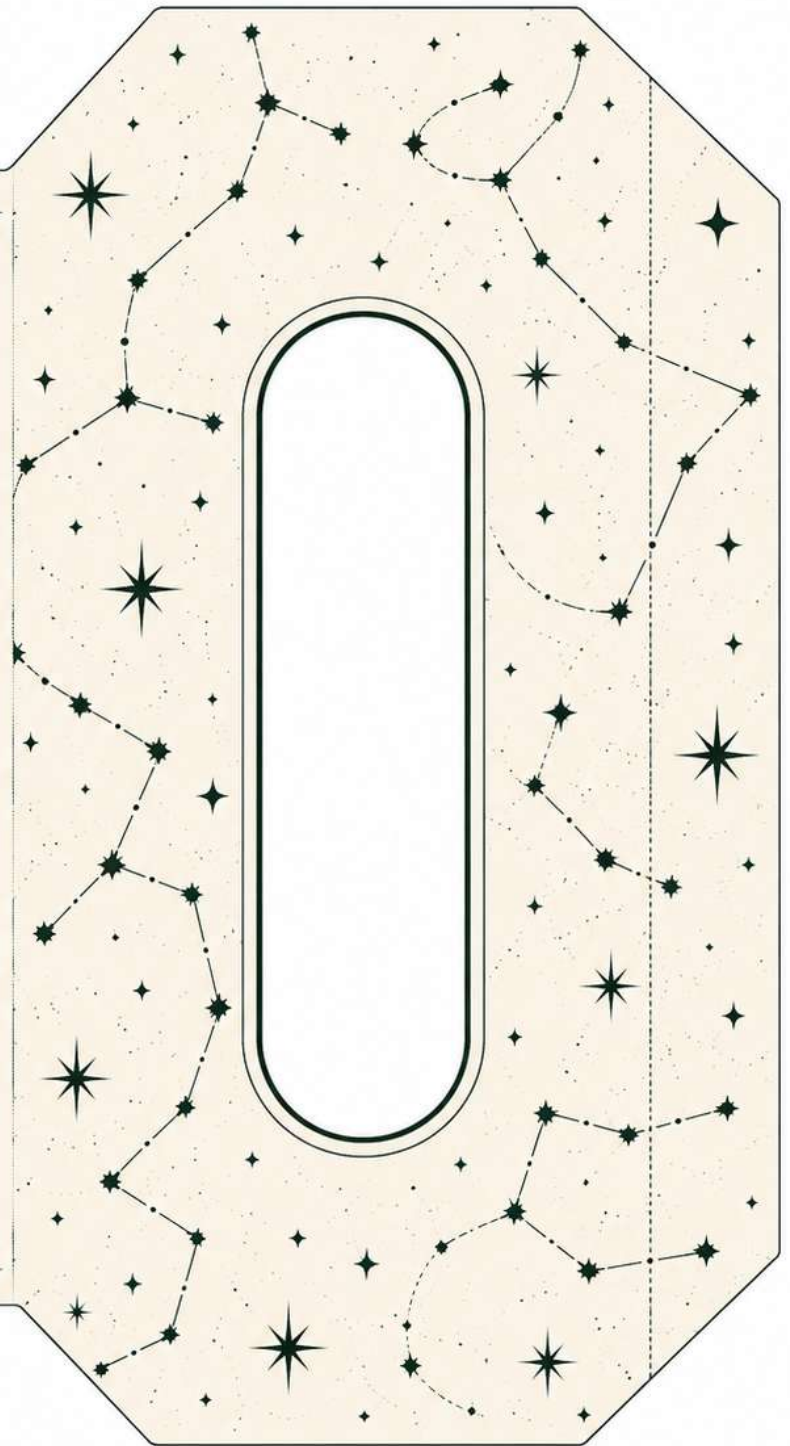
